GENERAL AIMS OF THE CONGRESS

INTRODUCTION

A team of ESNO nurse specialists and allied experts is building a programme rooted in today's healthcare realities — from ageing and vulnerability to preparedness, climate, digital health, antimicrobial resistance, and mental health. By weaving together science, practice, and policy, they are creating an agenda that showcases nursing innovation, leadership, and impact. The result will be a dynamic congress that inspires debate, sparks collaboration, and connects expertise across Europe.

SIX THEMATIC CLUSTERS

- 1 AGEING AND VULNERABILITY Covering all aspects of ageing, chronic conditions, frailty, incontinence and palliative approaches, with a focus on person-centred, dignity-driven care that ensures value for patients and systems.
- 2 PREPAREDNESS IN HEALTH SYSTEMS Including infection prevention, vaccination, outbreak response, and cross-border health collaboration, with nurses as pivotal actors in building resilient, value-driven health systems.
- 3 CLIMATE AND SUSTAINABILITY Exploring the nurse's contribution at the interdisciplinary level to reduce healthcare's environmental footprint, address climate-related health risks, and implement green, cost-effective practices.
- 4 DIGITAL HEALTH AND INNOVATION IN NURSING PRACTICE Harnessing AI, telehealth, wearable technologies, and interoperable health records to enhance patient outcomes, optimise resource use, and strengthen digital competencies in value-based care delivery.
- 5 ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE AND RESPONSIBLE PHARMACOLOGY Highlighting nurses' roles in antimicrobial stewardship, vaccination and education, safe prescribing practices -formal and informal-medication optimisation such as biosimilars, and optimum patient engagement, ensuring therapeutic high-value with evidence-based interventions.
- 6 MENTAL HEALTH, RESILIENCE, AND WORKFORCE WELLBEING Focusing on mental health in both patients and healthcare professionals, addressing burnout, moral injury such as 'second victim', and strategies for sustainable, supportive working environments and patient safety as an essential foundation for delivering value-based care.
